TIPS FOR WRITING AWARD-WINNING NOMINATIONS

We've pulled some expert tips together to help you write an award-winning nomination:

- Allow sufficient time to submit your entry
- Ensure your nomination provides sufficient information for the judges to assess
- Use word count wisely
- Link facts together
- Tell a story
- Do not make up stories

Please provide us with a project description. Your description of the project provides insight into the completion of the build, unique features, design constraints, challenges, innovations, etc. and will assist in the judging of your entry. Word documents containing descriptions are accepted. Descriptions around 200-300 words in length are ideal; maximum 400 words.

JUDGING PROCESS

A judging panel will assess each entry on the photos and descriptions received, all entries will take into account the following criteria:

- Quality of Finish
- Level of detail or difficulty
- Aspect with lighting
- Overall appearance



PHOTO SUBMISSIONS

A minimum of 6 photos and a MAXIMUM of 20 photos should be supplied. If an entry submits more than 20 photos, only the first 20 photos will be used for judging. Please select wisely your photos to be submitted.

I will be supplying (number of) high quality photos in JPG format via (please tick): \square email, \square online transfer or \square USB.

Please supply a minimum of six (6) 10" x 8" high resolution photographs for judging and presentation purposes, with one (1) external photo to reflect building design. Up to ten (10) work in progress can be supplied optionally.

Short videos less than 2MG per video can also be supplied. No more than 5 videos per entry.

The owner/builder/developer may have professional photography of the completed construction which you can request to be used for the Awards submission. Make sure you have obtained permission from the right people.

Photos are required to be sent electronically. Files over 5MB should be sent via online transfer (e.g. Dropbox or Hightail) or put on a USB. Entries with no photo and/or description attachments may not be included in the nominations.

I/We declare that all products have been installed to Manufacturers' Standards which includes the Australian Standards. I/We have obtained permission to nominate this project from the owner/builder. I/We agree to all conditions of entry into the AWCI Awards of Excellence program.

PHOTOGRAPHY TIPS

If you are taking your own photos, here are the top tips on getting the best shots of your work:

- Take photos during daylight hours for the best natural lighting.
 Turn on internal lights if possible.
- Stand back to take photos of the full room showing from floor to ceiling, and then take close ups to show the details of your work.
- Use a flat surface (i.e. bench, tripod) to make sure your photos aren't tilted, blurred or shaky.
- Make sure the space is tidy and there no people in that area. As a minimum, take photos with a high quality camera phone with clean lenses.
- Show off your work with photos taken from different angles.
